Since its inception, FIPS members have gathered every two year for a Congress at a ski resort in one of the member countries. The World congresses provide an opportunity for ski patrollers and friends from around the globe to learn from each other, grow together and benefit from each others experiences.

Congresses have been held in Italy, Canada, USA, Chile, Japan, South Korea, Australia, Sweden, Scotland and France.

At the congresses there are formal presentations, workshops, demonstrations and discussion groups that have targeted specific areas of patrolling. There are also side trips, skiing and tours. Some of the topics covered have included skier safety, training and education, medical aspects, innovations, statistics, injury types, disabled skiers, avalanche, evacuation techniques, administration of drugs, cross-country and downhill patrolling, snow board injuries, legal aspects, search and rescue, extended care, avalanche, and updates from the various countries. The FIPS Board of Directors also meets during each congress.


Getting there: By air from Moscow to Sochi International Airport (1,369 km - 2hr

The Rosa Khutor Alpine Resort (Russian: Pó3a Xýτop) is an alpine ski resort in Krasnodar Krai, Russia, located at the Aibga Ridge of the Western Caucasus along the Roza Khutor plateau near Krasnaya Polyana. Constructed from 2003 to 2011, it hosted the alpine skiing events for the 2014 Winter Olympics and Paralympics, based in nearby Sochi. The resort is 50 kilometers east of the Black Sea at Sochi; the majority of the slopes at Rosa Khutor face northeast, with the backside slopes facing southwest.
