


FIPS 2024 - Riksgränsen, Sweden - Feedback Summary

A FIPS World Congress is a professional development event for ski patrollers from around the world, coupled with social, cultural and skiing experiences.







### How many FIPS Congresses have you attended? 28 responses

- Risk Management. how to determine risk and what is acceptable risk
- Latest developments in treating spinal injuries

- Hands on medical treatments and
- Toboggan evacuation
- Medical: no specific topic in mind but keep up the good work with high quality speakers.
- Risk: relate to the general risk management of patrol areas more, rather than specifically issues related to litigation.
- Dogs: more of the same, as a non dog handler it was fascinating to get involved and find out more.

### The most memorable experience I had during the Congress was when I ... (only share if you can ;-). (17 responses)


- The ski race was great fun

# How could we improve your (and others) future FIPS Congress experience? (15 responses)


- Consider morning skiing and afternoon or evening lectures? (3)

#### Do you plan to attend FIPS 2026 in Canada?


